Bachelor's Button

Variety: Classic Magic (left), Choice Mix (right)

Light Conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Any with good drainage!

Spacing: 2-9"

Fun fact: Attractive, frosty appearance and an elegant addition to salads and desserts.



Butterfly and Hummingbird Mix

Flowers included: Butterfly Milkweed, Purple Coneflower, Blazing Star, Prairie Coneflower and many more!!

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average, well drained

Spacing: No specific spacing needed

Fun facts: Attract butterflies and hummingbirds from spring through fall



Calendula

Varieties (left to right): Alpha, Touch of Red Buff, Strawberry Blonde

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Rich/well drained

Spacing: 6-12"

Fun fact: Petals of the flowers can be used fresh or dried in "flower confetti," soups, soufflés, rice dishes, baked goods, and to garnish desserts



Celosia

Variety: Flamingo Feather

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Moist, fertile soil

Spacing: 6-12"

Fun fact: Uniform, upright plants produce tall, straight, sturdy stems with few leaves to strip away



Cosmos

Varieties (from left to right): Double Click Cranberries, Double Click Bicolor Violet, Versailles Mix, Rubenza

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Any conditions

Spacing: 9-12”

Fun fact: Strong stems perfect for cutting



Dianthus (carnation)

Variety: Chabaud Picotee Double Mix

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Rich, sandy, and well drained

Spacing: 6"

Fun fact: Use the flower petals to garnish salads, desserts, soups, icing, and cold drinks, flavor is of mild clove



Echinacea

Variety: Echinacea Purpurea

Light conditions: Full sun (can tolerate part shade)

Soil conditions: average, well drained

Spacing: 18-24"

Fun fact: Attracts and is a food source for bees



Hollyhock

Varieties (left to right): Creme de Cassis, Jet Black/Nigra

Majorette Double Champagne, Fiesta Time

Light conditions: Full/partial sun

Soil conditions: Will grow in any soil, but prefers rich, well-drained soil

Spacing: 12-18"

Fun fact: This pollinator-friendly biennial will beckon butterflies and invite the hummingbirds



Marigold

Varieties (left to right): Durango Outback Mix, Giant Orange, Red Gem

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Spacing: 8-18"

Fun fact: Edible flower tastes floral with hints of citrus and spice



Morning Glory

Varieties: Early Call (left), Grandpas Ott's (right)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Fun fact: This vigorous climber begins blooming in early summer and produce large attractive blooms



Nasturtium

Varieties: Tall Climbing Mix

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Well-drained soil

Fun fact: Both nasturtium leaves and flowers are edible with a peppery taste!



Pansy

Varieties (left to right): Frizzle Sizzle Mini Tapestry, Sorbet XP Autumn Select Mix,
Sorbet Formula Mix

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Rich, well draining

Fun fact: Decorative and edible garnish for salads and desserts with slight wintergreen
flavor



Poppy

Varieties: Black Swan, Ladybird, Florist Pepperbox, Jelly Beans Mix, Falling In Love

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average, moderate moisture

Spacing: 8-10"

Fun fact: Its elegant look is eye-catching both in the landscape and arrangements



Rudbeckia (Black eyed susan)

Variety: Indian Summer

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well draining

Spacing: 12-18"

Fun fact: Sturdy stems, vigorous branching



Snapdragon

Varieties: Potomac Early Sunrise Mix (left) and Potomac Summer Berry Blend (right)

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Moist, rich, well draining

Spacing: 4-12"

Fun fact: The flowers are a colorful garnish for use in salads, desserts, and drinks. The flavor is floral and slightly bitter, so use sparingly.



Statice

Varieties: Johnny's Pastel Mix (left) and Seeker Rose Shades (right)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Rich, well drained

Spacing: 12"

Fun fact: Perfect choice for a dried floral as it holds its color well and is easy to dry.



Sunflower

Variety: Top (left to right): Red, Gold Lite DMR, Buttercream, Mammoth

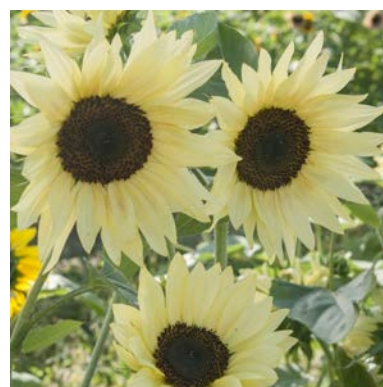
Bottom (left to right): White Lite, Bicolor, Orange Excel

Light Conditions: Full sun

Soil Conditions: Light/well drained

Spacing: 4-6"

Fun fact: Young sunflowers track the sun, which is also referred to as heliotropism.



Sweet Alyssum

Variety: Sweet Alyssum

Light Conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil Conditions: Average/well draining

Spacing: 6-8"

Fun fact: Attracts and provides a food source for beneficial insects such as lacewings, parasitic wasps, syrphid flies, and tachinid flies.



Yarrow

Variety: Flowerburst Red Shades

Light conditions: Full sun (tolerates part shade)

Soil conditions: Any well drained

Spacing: 12-24”

Fun fact: Attracts and supports beneficial insects such as damsel bugs, lacewings, lady beetles, and parasitic wasps.



Zinnia

Variety: Giant Dahlia

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: fertile/rich

Spacing: 9-12”

Fun fact: Prolific blooms all season long!



HERBS

Basil, Italian

Varieties (left to right): Cardinal, Genovese, and Prospera

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Moderately rich and moist

Spacing: 4-8"

Fun fact: Well-suited for leaf and tip harvest



Basil, Speciality

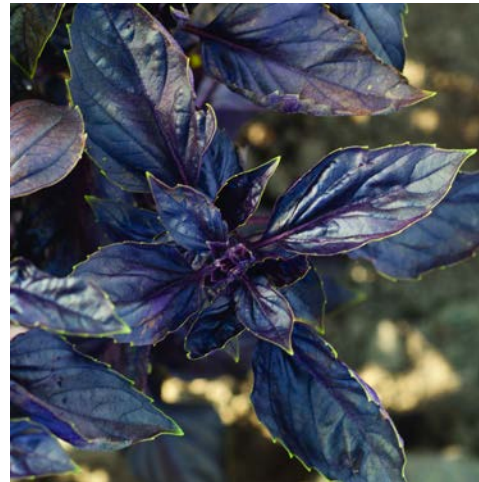
Varieties: Cardinal (Thai), Mrs. Burns Lemon (Citrus Basil),
Red Rubin (Purple Basil), Kapoor Tulsi/Kapoor Sacred (Tulsi Basil)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Moderately rich and moist

Spacing: 4-8"

Fun fact: Well-suited for leaf and tip harvest. Fragrant and delicious for cooking and tea.



Catnip

Variety: Catnip

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Any

Spacing: 12-18"

Fun fact: Perfect for your cat!



Chamomile

Variety: Roman Chamomile

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Slightly acidic to average

Spacing: 8-12”

Fun facts: Many people drink chamomile tea for its relaxing properties and calming effects on the digestive system.



Cilantro

Varieties: Calypso and Cruiser

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Rich, well drained

Spacing: $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Fun fact: Cilantro is in the same family as carrots, celery, and parsley.



Chives

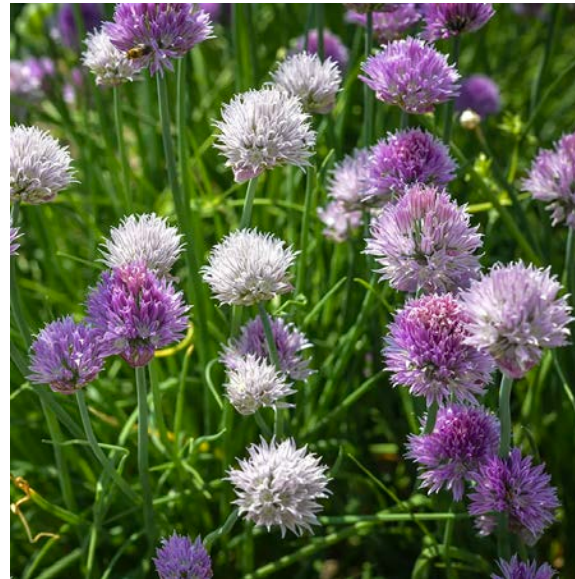
Variety: Common Chive

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: average

Spacing: 3-9"

Fun fact: Chives are a natural pest repellent



Dill

Variety: Hera

Light conditions: Full sun

Solid conditions: Rich/average

Spacing: 4"

Fun fact: Dill can be used as a remedy for hiccups!



Lavender

Variety: Ellegance Purple

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Spacing: 12”

Fun fact: An outstanding English Lavender variety selected on the basis of its uniformity, color, and extremely free-flowering and floriferous qualities over a prolonged period of time during the season.



Mint

Variety: Marvelous Mix

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Spacing: 12”

Fun fact: Mint is a natural insect repellent.



Oregano

Variety: Greek Oregano

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Well draining

Spacing: 12”

Fun fact: Great for pizza and Italian cooking



Parsley

Variety: Darki (left) and Giant of Italy (right)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Moist, fertile soil

Spacing: 8-12"

Fun fact: Parsley encourages hoverflies and parasitic wasps, and it's also a caterpillar food for swallowtail butterflies.



Rosemary

Variety: Primed Rosemary

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: light, well drained

Spacing: 24-36"

Fun fact: Flowers are small and also edible,
they have a bold rosemary flavor



Sage

Variety: Common Sage

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Well draining

Spacing: 12”

Fun fact: Sage appears to contain a range of anti-inflammatory and antioxidant compounds.



Thyme

Variety: German Winter

Light conditions: Full sun to partial shade

Soil conditions: Well drained

Spacing: 6-8"

Fun fact: The flowers are small and edible and have a mild thyme flavor.



VEGETABLES & FRUITS

Beans

Variety: Annihilator

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Spacing: 2-4"

Fun fact: No trellis is needed for this bush bean variety.



Beets

Variety: Red Ace (left) and Boro (right)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well drained

Spacing: 3"

Fun fact: With its vibrant deep color, beet juice is often used as a natural dye.



Broccolini

Variety: Happy rich

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well drained

Spacing: 12-24"

Fun fact: Produces generous amounts of side shoots



Cabbage

Variety: Early Jersey Wakefield Cone Cabbage

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well drained

Spacing: 12-18"

Fun fact: It's compact size and the fact that it does well planted close makes it ideal for the raised bed gardener



Cauliflower

Variety: Lavender and Song TJS-65

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Average

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: A great choice for dipping platters



Cucumber

Variety (left to right): Supremo, Poinsett, and Marketmore

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well drained soil

Spacing: 12”

Fun fact: Cucumbers most prolific with frequent harvesting and consistent watering



Eggplant

Variety (left to right): Dancer, Beatrice, Nadia

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well drained

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: Eggplant stems are often spiny, so wear gloves when harvesting!



Kale

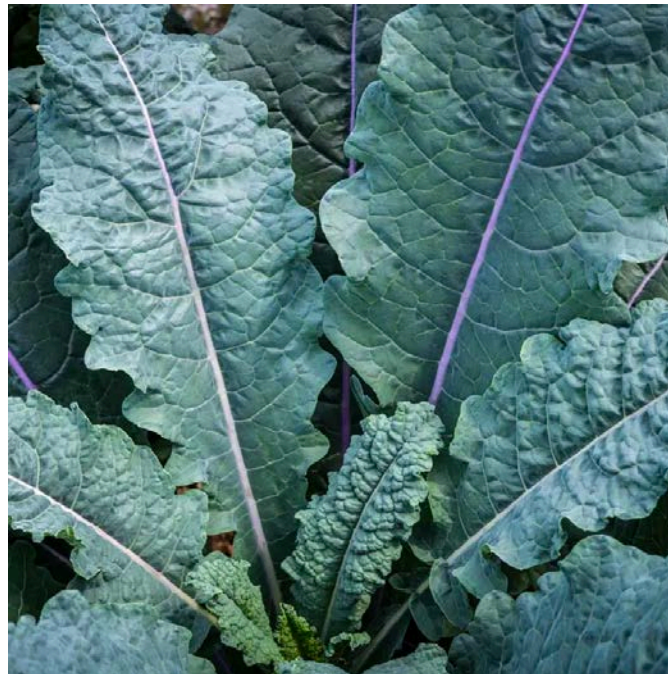
Variety: Dazzling blue lacinato

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well draining

Spacing: 12-18"

Fun fact: Lacinato kale is also known as dinosaur kale



Lettuce, head

Variety: Landis Winter (bottom), Merlot (right),
and Optima (left)

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil condition: Average, well draining

Spacing: 8"

Fun fact: Lettuce started as a weed around the Mediterranean Sea



Lettuce Mix

Variety: Oscarde, Green Deer Tongue, Black Seeded Simpson,

Lilli Di Vino, Jack Ice, Elf ears

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: average

Spacing: 6"

Fun fact: You can harvest all season long, either by harvesting only the outer leaves or cutting all the leaves and letting the plant regrow.



Melons

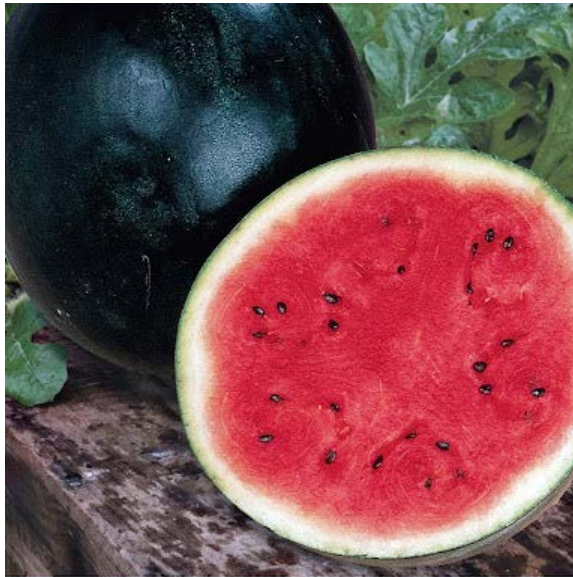
Variety: Sugar Baby Watermelon

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Light, well-drained soil

Spacing: 18–36"

Fun fact: Their tough rinds resist cracking.



Peas

Variety: Sugar Ann

Light conditions: Full sun, will still produce in partial shade

Soil conditions: Rich, well-drained soil

Spacing: 1-3"

Fun fact: Sugar Ann variety has dwarf vines and matures exceptionally early.



Peppers (Hot) - Habanero

Variety: Helios

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: The helios variety has early, high yielding plants with big fruits.



Peppers (Hot) - Jalapeño

Variety: Pantera

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: As with all peppers, pick the first peppers promptly when they reach full size to encourage further fruit set.



Peppers (Hot) - Korean Chili Pepper

Variety: Hong-Gochu

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: Bright red fruits with thin skins. Perfect for kimchi and drying down for gochugaru (chili flakes) and gochujang (fermented chili paste). Mild/medium heat.



Peppers (Hot) - Poblano

Variety: Baston, Baron

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: Dehydrated red, ripened poblanos are also known as Ancho chiles.



Peppers (Hot) - Scotch Bonnet

Variety: Scotch Bonnet

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: An extremely hot relative to the habanero. Particularly important in West African and Caribbean cuisine where it is used in hot sauces, jerk chicken, and many other dishes.



Peppers (Hot) - Shishito

Variety: Shishito

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: Small, mild Japanese pepper for roasting, pan-frying, grilling. Typically harvested green.



Peppers (Sweet)

Variety (left to right): Carmen, Escamillo, King of the North, Jimmy Nardello's

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-drained, fertile soil

Spacing: 18"

Fun fact: Yes, Jimmy Nardello's really are sweet! All peppers can be harvested green as well.



Pumpkins

Variety: New England Pies

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: well drained

Spacing: 4-5'

Fun fact: The average pumpkin has approximately 500 seeds, which are delicious roasted.



Scallions

Variety: Parade

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: well drained

Spacing: 6-8"

Fun fact: Scallions can be used to repel insects. Their greens will also continue to grow as long as you leave the roots in the soil.



Spinach

Variety: Corvair

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: fertile/moist

Spacing: 6"

Fun fact: Popeye's popularity increased consumption of spinach in the U.S. by 33% in the 1930's



Swiss Chard

Variety: Fordhook Giant

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: average

Spacing: 12–18"

Fun fact: Swiss chard is a relative of beets!



Tomatillo

Variety: Toma Verde

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Well-draining

Spacing: 24-36"

Fun fact: Tomatillos are an indeterminate plant, meaning they will continue to flower and fruit until frost.



Tomatoes, Cherry

Variety: Sungold, Sweetie, Supersweet 100, Jasper, Cherry Buzz, Gold Nugget, Sunrise Bumble Bee, Blush, Black Cherry, Indigo Cherry Drop

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Medium-rich, well draining soil

Spacing: 24–36"

Fun fact: Like plum tomatoes, cherries are great in sauces because they are packed with pectin.



Tomatoes, Heirloom

Variety: Top (left to right): Pink Boar, Black Krim, Nepal, Copia, Moskovich

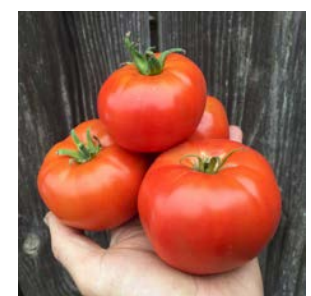
Bottom (left to right): Brandywine, Rose de Berne, Cherokee Purple, Black Brandywine

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Medium-rich, well draining soil

Spacing: 24–36"

Fun fact: Heirlooms are typically sweeter than the average tomato. A good rule of thumb is that yellow/pink varieties are milder and sweeter whereas black/purple varieties are more acidic with rich flavor.



Tomatoes, Sauce/Paste

Variety (left to right): Speckled Roman, San Marzano, Blue Beech

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Medium-rich, well draining soil

Spacing: 24–36"

Fun fact: Meaty red flesh has little juice, is good for fresh eating, and cooks quickly into sauce.



Tomatoes, Slicing

Variety: Big Beef

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Medium-rich, well draining soil

Spacing: 24–36"

Fun fact: Full flavor, top choice for fresh market beefsteak tomatoes.



Zucchini/Summer Squash

Variety: Top (left to right): Green Machine, Spineless Perfection

Bottom (left to right): Safari, Golden Glory, Zephyr

Light conditions: Full sun

Soil conditions: Fertile, well-drained

Spacing: 18-24"

Fun fact: The squash blossoms are also delicious!
